Doubt to Devotion - by G O Evangelist Peter Buta

Brother Koboi was once a devoted member of a protestant church in Liberia. However, his faith in the institution faltered when he felt that the church's actions were not aligning with Christian values. Disillusioned, he left the protestant Church and joined another denomination in Zorzor, where he served as an evangelist alongside the pastor.

One evening, after returning from Bible study, Koboi discovered a troubling situation. The pastor had locked himself inside Koboi's room. Despite repeated knocks, the pastor refused to open the door. Left with no choice, Koboi stayed with a friend for the night. The next morning, Koboi returned home to find the pastor in the bathroom and drugs scattered across his living room table.

He took photos of the scene and reported the matter to the church headquarters in Voinjama. To his disappointment, the leadership dismissed his concerns and encouraged him to continue his work. Frustrated, Koboi decided to leave the church entirely.



He concluded, "The Bible is not real, and I will not go to church anymore." Together with his wife, he resolved to avoid any religious involvement and to raise their children without church teachings.

When I met Brother Koboi I invited him to join our Bible study group. He declined, expressing his disbelief in the Bible. However, I began studying with his children and eventually shared information about the Central Liberia Mission's Camp Meeting, scheduled for December.

When the children told their parents about the camp meeting, Koboi and his wife initially resisted. They said, "We don't want anyone lying to you about the Bible, and we don't want you to join any church." Nevertheless, they decided to attend the event as a family to see for themselves.

During the camp meeting, the family attended the evening campaigns. After listening to the first and second sermons, Koboi's wife noticed something. "This message is

different," she remarked. She later told her husband, "This is the Good Church."

Moved by the teachings and the sense of authenticity, Brother Koboi and his wife made a life-changing decision. On the morning of December 25, 2024, they were both baptized.

Today, Brother Koboi and his family are living testimonies to the transformative power of faith. Their journey from doubt to devotion reminds us that God works in mysterious ways.

Deliverance!

The Adokouli family, with their two young daughters, lived in the deeply animist community of Anié. Their lives were marked by relentless spiritual attacks, leaving them frequently ill. Desperate for healing, the parents sought help from local witch doctors, but their suffering persisted. Worse still, the community began to accuse their daughters of bringing misfortune to the village, adding to their distress.

During one of my missionary visits to Anié, I met the mother of these two little girls. She was overwhelmed with fear and hopelessness, searching for a way out. Moved by her plight, we organized regular prayer sessions over a period of three months, meeting every week to intercede for the family.

As we prayed, the spiritual battle became evident. During one intense session, the evil spirits spoke through the children, declaring they would not leave. But through fervent prayer, we persisted, calling on the name of Jesus.

Then, by the grace of God, deliverance came—the spirits threw the girls to the ground before finally departing

With great joy, we proclaim that the two girls have been completely healed and set free! Their family, witnessing the power of God, gave their lives to Jesus, and the parents were baptized. The once-rejected daughters are now thriving. They have started attending school and



have become a source of joy to their family. Even the community, which once accused them, has stopped calling them witches.

This miraculous deliverance has sparked a greater movement—what began as prayers for one family has led to the formation of a neighborhood prayer group in the Adokouli family’s community. More and more people are coming to seek God and experience His transforming power.

One evening, as we were leaving a prayer meeting at the church, I noticed a woman crying on a street corner. Moved by compassion, I approached her to offer comfort. She tearfully shared that her husband had just thrown her out of their home because she did not understand how to be his partner.

After listening to her pain, I encouraged her to return home so we could seek reconciliation. It was not an easy task as her husband was deeply upset. However, after much discussion, he agreed to take her back—on one condition: that I personally teach his wife how to be a good partner in their marriage.

I gladly accepted the challenge and committed to visiting them twice a week to share biblical principles of

a joyful and harmonious family life.

Over the next four months, the woman’s attitude and behavior began to change. Her husband took notice. Then, one day, he called me with wonderful news—he and his wife wanted to come and worship with us at the church!

It was a moment of great joy to receive them into our fellowship. Their marriage, once filled with pain and division, was now a source of happiness and renewal. They became a model couple in their neighborhood, inspiring others with their testimony.

As their faith grew, the husband took an important step--he went to officially pay the bride price to his wife’s family, something he had never done before. The in-laws,

touched by his transformation, rejoiced and praised God for the beautiful example of their restored marriage.

Today, this couple attends church regularly, and in December, they made a public declaration of their faith through baptism.
